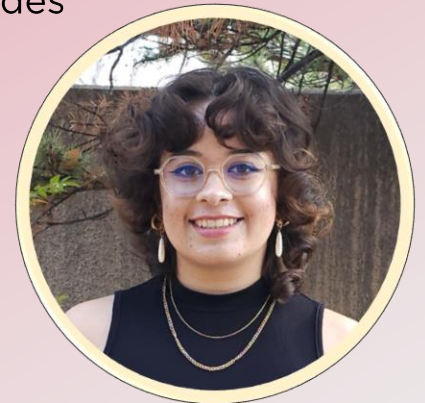

- Be a member of underrepresented racial and ethnic groups
